“Revelation and Response” – Nehemiah 8 - 10

Questions for Reflection and Discussion:

(These are to be used personally, with family or with your Small Group)

1. Read Nehemiah 8:1-4 as a group. Consider times in which God has used physical situations to bring you to a new awareness of God’s faithful presence with you. Share those stories with each other.
2. Read Nehemiah 9:5-38. How does the story of God’s faithfulness to the people of Israel move you? In what similar ways have you experienced God providing in your own life, or in the history of your extended family?
3. What practices and habits do you have that help remind you of the story of God?
4. In what ways do you see the cultural values of our world (e.g. individualism, consumerism, materialism) pulling you away from your calling as a holy follower of Jesus?
5. How do you experience the pressure to compartmentalize your life between “church/worship” and “everything else”?
6. Nathan talked about holiness in two different ways. The first is that holy means to be “not common.” The second was that holiness means “wholeness.” Both of these images of holiness speak to being a different kind of people. It means that God is interested in every part of your life. All of it is in the realm and care

of God; our leisure, sexuality, work, worship, spending, attitudes, studies etc. Share how that makes you feel. Is that different from how you have considered holiness before?

7. Spend some time writing down or sharing every name and title that Jesus has in scripture.
8. As you consider the majesty and wonder of Jesus what are the areas that you need to confess to the Lord?
